

AHTrimble.com CommPlan Info for Indianapolis, IN

Before reading any further please read the AHTrimble - Channel Plan document. The document can be found on the private customer website page you were given access to via email after your radio order was shipped.

Detail of your CommPlan -

Channels 27 - 37 are programmed for EchoLink repeaters in your area. EchoLink is a computer-based Amateur Radio system distributed free of charge that allows radio amateurs to communicate with other amateur radio operators using Voice over IP (VoIP) technology on the Internet for at least part of the path between them. For more information on EchoLink please refer to echolink.org.

To readily identify EchoLink repeaters on your display screen the channel name begins with "EL" (EchoLink). In addition to the "EL" you will see 3 or 4 letters that further identify the town in which the repeater is located. If there is more than one repeater in that town that has been programmed into the radio a number will appear after the town.

Example: "ELINDP2" = EchoLink repeater located in Indianapolis - #2.

But don't worry, you can always refer to your "cheat sheet" for more information.

Channels 38 - 41 are programmed for a group of repeaters linked together in the area. The "comment" section of the "cheat sheet" will tell you where they are located. For reference, "linked" means that everything transmitted to one of the linked repeaters can be heard on all of the linked repeaters. This gives you considerably larger operational are.

Channels 42 - 73 are programmed for individual repeaters in the area immediately surrounding Indianapolis. I only programmed repeaters that are listed as "open" for public use. But, you will not want to tie up a repeater for personal use. Good radio etiquette is appreciated.

Channels 0 and 74 - 85 are available for your programming. I would suggest getting to know your radio and the area before programming the radio with additional channels.
